The Lord strong and mighty,

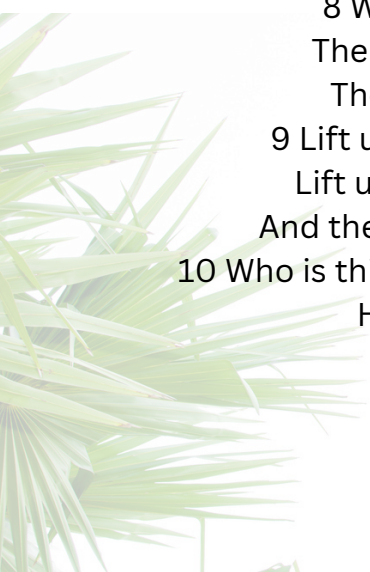
The Lord mighty in battle.

April Scripture & Devotional Series: Celebrating the Resurrection:

Week 1 - April 7

Scripture: Luke 24:6-7

“He is not here, but has risen! Remember how he told you, while He was still in Galilee, that the Son of Man must be delivered into the hands of sinful men and be crucified, and on the third day rise.”

Devotional Thought:

The resurrection is the cornerstone of our faith; proof that Jesus conquered death, and offers us new life. Even when things seem hopeless, remember that Jesus' victory gives us reason to hope and live boldly

Week 2 - April 14

Scripture: 1 Peter 1:3

“Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ! According to his great mercy, he has caused us to be born again to a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead”

Devotional Thought:

Through Jesus' resurrection, we are given new birth and a living hope; something that never fades. This hope sustains us through trials, reminding us that no matter what, God's mercy and life-transforming power are always at work.

Week 3 - April 21

Scripture: Romans 6:9

“We know that Christ, being raised from the dead, will never die again; death no longer has dominion over Him.”

Devotional Thought

Because Jesus rose and defeated death forever, we can live free from fear and despair. His resurrection guarantees that death and darkness do not have the last word, for us or for all creation.

Week 4 - April 28

Scripture: I John 11:25

“I am the resurrection and the life. The one who believes in me will live, even though they die.”

Devotional Thought:

Jesus speaks these words as an invitation to trust in Him fully. He offers eternal life to everyone who believes in Him. A life that begins now and lasts forever.
